

Dr Mathew Muturi, Co-leader of Kenya's Zoonotic Disease Unit



Dr Mathew Muturi is a field epidemiologist working for the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries in Kenya. He is a veterinarian with postgraduate training in Applied Epidemiology from the Kenya Field Epidemiology and Laboratory Training Program. He currently co-heads the Zoonotic Disease Unit, a One Health (OH) coordination office formed between the Kenya Ministries of Human and Livestock health.

His main interests are public health systems research and linked zoonotic disease studies. Mathew is currently a graduate fellow at the International Livestock Research Institute's Animal and Human Health Program.

In addition to his in-country experience, he has served as a One Health expert and consultant for the World Health Organisation (joint external evaluation and OH bridging workshops expert), U.S. Sandia National Laboratory (OH programs in Kenya and Somalia) and U.S. Global Implementation Solutions (OH programs in Nigeria, Tanzania, Somalia, Ukraine and Kenya).
